RESOLUTIONS TO STATE DIVISION



Minnesota Division Meeting in April

Six Breckenridge Chapter members (Larry Kennebec, Dick Brown, Bill Barton, Dell Erickson, Steve Schaust, John Rust) attended the Minnesota Division meeting in Wabasha during the week-end of April 21-22.

We went on various field trips, including visiting the National Eagle Center and the Weaver Sand Dunes. The Weaver Sand Dunes is home to a large population of endangered Blanding's turtles. When the baby turtles hatch, they walk 1-2 miles or more to wetlands from their hatching grounds. Many fall prey to eagles, raccoons, and other wildlife.

Of the four Breckenridge Chapter resolutions submitted to the MN Division, 2 were passed.

1) Sustainable Population Resolution – Did not pass (10 for, 22 against)

2) MN Wolf Hunting season (not at the same time as the deer hunting season) – Passed (2 against, 2 abstain)

- 3) Fair Boat Licensing Did not pass (5 yes, no 15, abstain 2).
- 4) Yellowstone Bison and Elk buffer on public lands Passed (unanimous)

Other resolutions passed were:

- 1) Silica Sand Mining Passed (1-against) (Libbey Chapter Grand Rapids)
- 2) Corporate Personhood Passed (unanimous) (Libbey Chapter Grand Rapids)
- 3) Fossil Fuel Fee/Dividend Passed (2 against) MN Division

We stayed at the Historic Anderson House in Wabasha. The dinner and social hour Saturday evening was excellent and enjoyed by all. The silent auction for the MN Division generated over \$1000 for college scholarships that the MN Division awards each year (these scholarships are separate from those awarded by the Breckenridge Chapter). Sunday afternoon we had a very enjoyable lunch on a patio overlooking the Mississippi River. Just a wonderful time had by all!
